Why experience the Q'ero Raymi?

Participating in the **Q'ero Raymi** is to immerse yourself in the deepest **essence** of the **Andes**. It is the **sacred encounter** with the last living **lineage** of the **Incas**, an opportunity to work on your **inner growth** and **heal your mind** and **body** through the vital energy of **Pachamama** and the **Apus**.

The **Q'ero masters (Paq'os)**, rightful heirs of **Andean energetic knowledge**, will dedicate their **ancestral wisdom** to work with your being, helping you **release** the burdens of the **past** and **harmonize** your **present**. This is not a simple **tourist visit**; it is a **life-changing experience** where the **community** embraces you with sincerity and the **masters** guide you so that you return home with **renewed consciousness** and an **open heart**.



Why participate in this ceremony with us?

Cultural immersion: You will spend time living and sharing with the **Q'ero families**, learning firsthand about their **daily life** and **sacred traditions**.

Spiritual healing: The **Q'ero** are masters of **natural and energetic healing**. You will take part in **authentic ceremonies** designed to cleanse and restore your **spiritual** and **emotional well-being**.

Unique landscapes: The journey takes you through **stunning Andean landscapes**, from the high-altitude **puna** to the lush edge of the **jungle**.

Authenticity and living practice: The ceremonies and activities offered correspond to **practices** still active within the **Ayllu Q'ero**, expressions of **cultural** and **spiritual life** that continue to be part of the **community's daily life**, carried out with respect for their **principles** and **traditional organization**.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL TO Q'ERO – JULY 28

We begin with a **pickup** from your hotel in **Cusco** to head towards **Ninamarka**. Here, we will make a brief stop to explore its **enigmatic set of chullpas**, or **pre-Inca funerary towers**. Then, we continue to the picturesque town of **Paucartambo**, the **folkloric capital** of the region, where you will have the opportunity to make any **final purchases** needed for the journey.

The ascent continues until we reach **Pampak'asa (4,512 m / 14,803 ft)**, the **highest point** of our route and the threshold that officially welcomes us to the territory of the **Q'ero Nation**. After a short rest in **Chua Chua**, the first **Q'ero village** you will see, we will begin a descent of approximately one hour until we finally reach the **sacred village of Hatun Q'ero**. Upon arrival in **Q'ero**, transportation will drop you off approximately one kilometer before the **ceremonial space**.

This journey marks your **first spiritual contact** with the territory and the beginning of the first **ancestral ritual of energetic cleansing**. In this **ceremonial space**, the **Paqo** will be waiting to welcome you and explain the meaning of the ceremony to be performed. He will be responsible for offering the **k'intus**, guiding this **first moment of connection and respect** with the **energies of nature**.





In this way, the **entrance through Arco Punku** begins, a **sacred portal** designed for the release of **negative energies** such as worries, anxieties, problems, illnesses, and emotional burdens. Inside the arch, there will be **water**, a symbol of **purification**, used to **cleanse and harmonize energies**.

At the end of passing through the arch, the **Q'apache** will be performed, a **ritual act** intended to dispel dense energies from the **body, mind, and spirit**. This process will be accompanied by **traditional Q'ero music**, facilitating the connection with the **wind** and the **forces of nature**.

Thus, upon completing the passage through **Arco Punku**, the visitor enters **Q'ero** with **renewed energy**, in **harmony and spiritual openness**, prepared to continue the **sacred journey** within the community. Afterwards, participants will be served **lunch prepared by their chef**, take the afternoon to **explore the village surroundings**, and spend the night in a **traditional house assigned to the group**.





Day 2: Ceremonial Program – Q'ero Raymi - JULY 29

I. Awakening and Gathering at Cruzpata

The day begins with the **sacred call** of the **Pututus (K'epas)**, an **ancestral sound** that greets **Tayta Inti** and summons the **cuatro suyus**. In this **gathering space**, the **Paqos** and the **Inka Warayoq** perform the **Hallpari**, sharing **k'intus of coca** to strengthen **spiritual union**. Finally, the procession passes through **Arco Punku**, the **portal of purification**, to offer their prayers before the **main waka**, uniting **ancestral faith** and the **living devotion** of the people.

II. Central Ceremony at the Ushnu (Escuela Pampa)

Entry into the **sacred space** is blessed by the **Hunqoy Pichaq**, who, through the **ritual incense (K'apache)**, cleanses and harmonizes the environment. Under the sound of **ancestral music**, the **Central Ceremony** begins, opening the **three worlds (Hanaq, Kay, and Ukhu Pacha)** in honor of the **cuatro suyus**. With the permission of the **Warayoq**, the **Paqos** and **Ñustas** begin the construction of the **Great Offering**. The public is invited to participate actively, offering their **k'intus** and **intentions** to be integrated into this **sacred ceremony of reciprocity**.

III. Pilgrimage and Fire Offering at the Pukaras

The **Paq'o** and **Yanapay** assume the **sacred role** of carrying the offerings in a **colorful pilgrimage** to the **Pukaras**. Amid **dances** and **chants**, we proceed to these **energetic points**:

- **Qhoro Marka (Hanan Q'ero)**: The **high point**, dwelling of **masculine energy**.
- **Mantur Pujyu (Hurin Q'ero)**: The **low point**, linked to **feminine energy**

Upon arrival at the **Pukara**, the **Sacred Fire** is lit.

The **Paq'o** places the offering into the flames, raising the **petitions** and **thanks** of all participants to the **Apus** and **Pachamama**, thus renewing our **sacred connection with life**. The ceremony ends with the return, followed by the serving of **traditional lunch**.

IV. Message

After lunch, the **Paqos** share the reading of the **ceremonial messages**. In a gesture of **Ayni (reciprocity)**, the **Inka Warayoq** invites all participants to join the **festivity**, with the purpose of sharing and strengthening the **bonds** between visitors and the **local community**.

V. Grand Festivity and Gathering of Energies

The afternoon transforms into an **explosion of joy** with the **Grand Q'ero Festivity**. The sound of **flutes** and **drums** invites everyone to join the **Tinkuy dance**. The event concludes with the **official closure**, sealing the hearts of the attendees with the **magic** and **wisdom** of the **Q'ero Nation**, the last **Inka Ayllu**, leaving a trace of **peace** and **spiritual renewal** in each participant.





Performances of Traditional Q'ero Music and Dances:

Arco Tankay – A celebration that honors the quality of Q'ero textiles. It features an exhibition of various woven pieces and a community game, where the family that has produced the largest number of textiles is recognized, while others participate by helping carry the weight of the textile art, strengthening community unity.

Sargento – An ancestral dance that symbolizes the Andean bird Q'yllwa, expressing gratitude toward animals, especially the birds of the Andes.



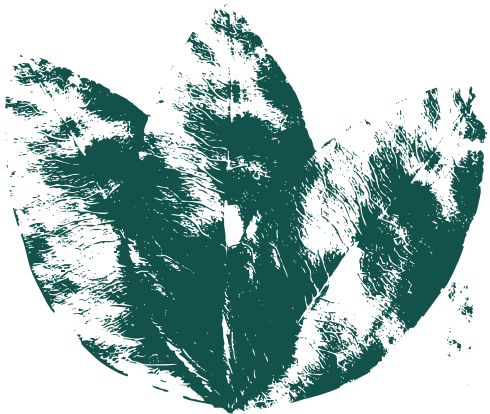
Machu Tarpay – A celebration in gratitude to the llamas, animals essential to the Q'ero people, historically allies in transportation and daily life.

Pukllay – The largest festivity of the Q'ero community. It represents the union of the ayllus, expressing the deepest feelings of joy, gratitude, and harmonious togetherness.



Tinkuy – A festivity of joy and young love, held in the mountains, where contemporary music is integrated through the cultural vision and sensitivity of the Q'ero.





INCLUDED

Pre-Departure Meeting (Online or In-Person): Two days before the trip, you will receive all the necessary information about the experience. This meeting will be held virtually or in person and is scheduled for **6:00 p.m.**, during which we will answer questions and provide recommendations for the journey.

Transportation: Transportation is provided from your hotel in **Cusco** to the starting point of the experience. At the end of the tour, our vehicle will pick you up in **Hatun Q'ero** and return you to Cusco.

Entry Fees: Includes admission to the **Ninamarca archaeological complex**, the visit to the **Q'ero community**, and participation in the **Q'ero Raymi event**.

Professional Guide: You will be accompanied by a professional guide fluent in **Quechua, Spanish, and English**, who will accompany you throughout the entire experience.

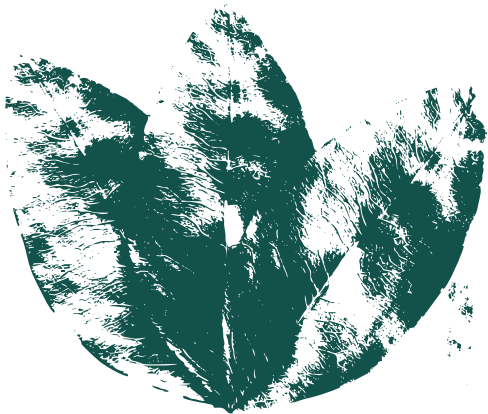
Accommodation in a Traditional House: Stay in a **traditional house** in **Hatun Q'ero**, where you can experience authentic **community living**.

Sleeping Mats: **Mats** are provided for resting during your stay.

Meals: Our **chefs** will prepare meals for the group.

Ritual or Ceremonial Experience: The **Q'ero community** is a place of deep **spiritual energy**, ideal for receiving **blessings** and connecting with **nature** through **ancestral rituals**.





NOT INCLUDED

Travel Insurance:

Not mandatory, but **highly recommended**, especially for travelers coming from sea-level areas, who should **acclimate to the altitude of Cusco** at least 1–2 days before the experience.

Traditional Buffet Lunch:

Prepared by the **host community**, using **local and seasonal products**, featuring a variety of **traditional dishes** that reflect the culinary knowledge of the region, offering participants a **gastronomic experience** representative of **Andean culture** and its food practices.

Flashlights or Headlamps:

It is recommended to bring a **headlamp** for the camping nights, as there is no lighting at the campsites. **Handheld flashlights** are also acceptable.

First Breakfast and Last Dinner:

Meals typically begin with **lunch on Day 1** and end with **lunch on the last day**.

Tips are always appreciated and should be given based solely on your **level of satisfaction** with the service.

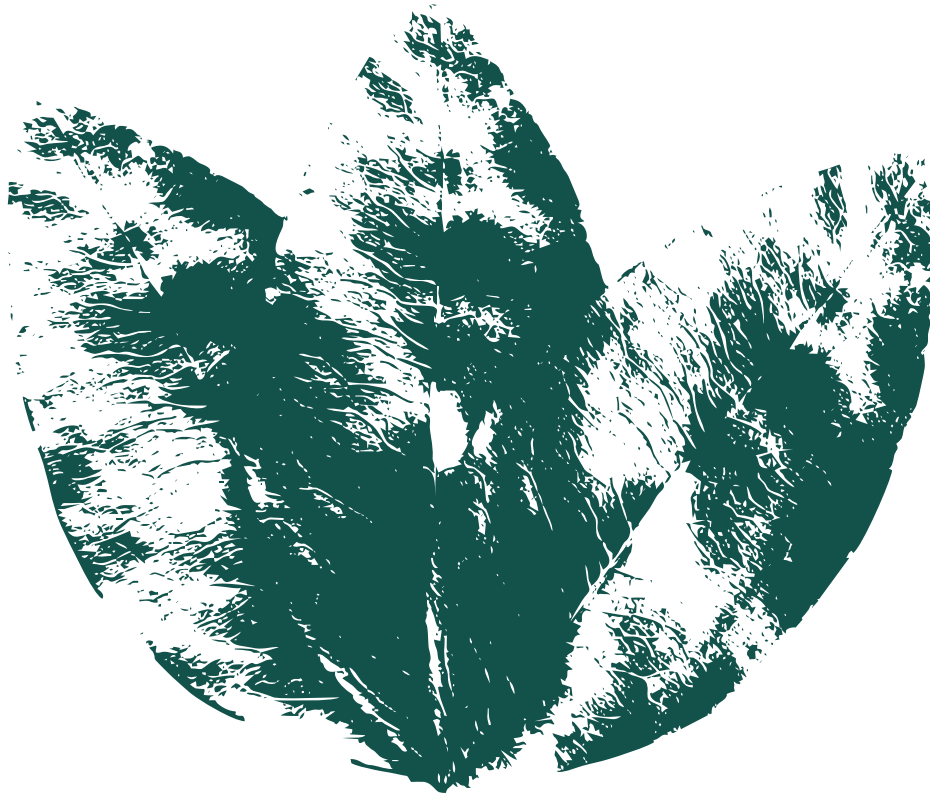
Additional Personal Expenses:

Participants must bring **appropriate clothing** and **personal trekking equipment**.



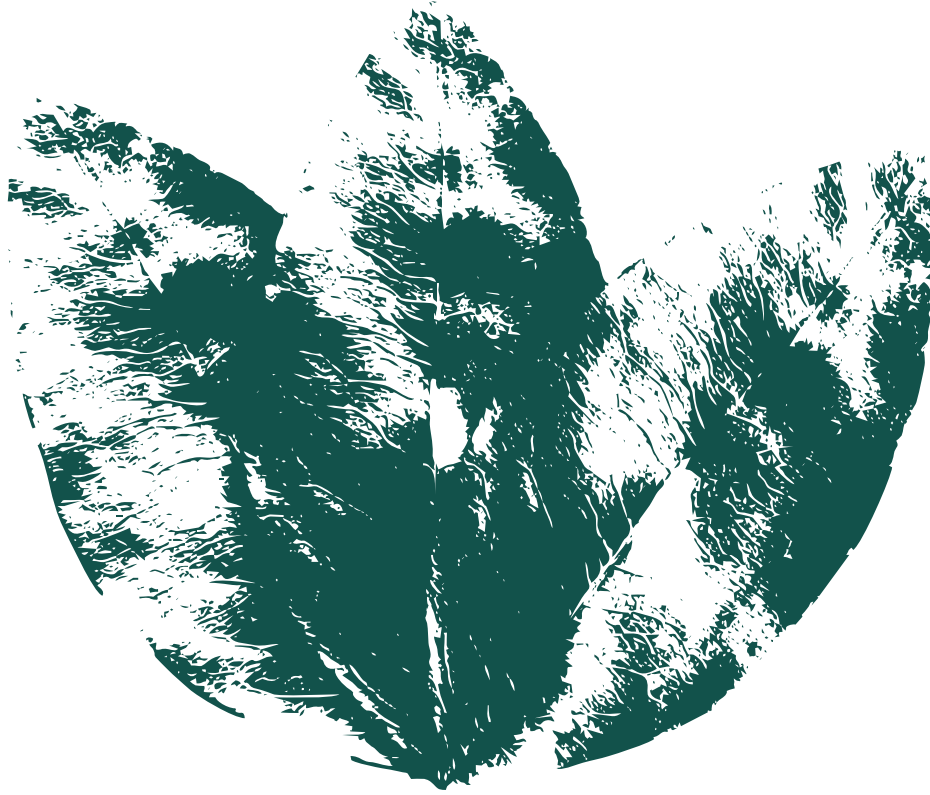


RECOMMENDATION

- Avoid alcohol, red meat, or heavy substances** 24 hours before the hike
